I believe anyone can be on a committee; they do not have to be a member of the community. Del is not the only non-community member of a committee. Here is what our bylaws say and they are devoid of language that says members, members in good standing or any such verbiage other than those specific to board members.

Section 1 - COMMITTEES

The President shall appoint members of all Standing and Special Committees for a term not to exceed the balance of the fiscal year and designate the chairman chairperson of each committee. The number and personnel of each committee shall be determined by the Board of Directors, except as otherwise set out herein, except that each committee shall include at least one (1) member, other than the President, of the Board of Directors and that the Nominating Committee shall include at least two (2) members, other than the President, of the Board of Directors. The President shall be an ex-officio member of each Standing Committee except the Nominating Committee. No paid employee who is a committee member shall have a vote on any matter pertaining to their employment. Each year, to the extent practical, at least one member of each committee shall be appointed on the next year's committee to maintain continuity of performance. Ad Hoc committees shall be formed for a specified purpose and for a specified time.

Section 2 - DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

All committees shall serve without power, except as specifically delegated by the Board of Directors, and as such shall refer all proposed actions to the Board of Directors with such frequency as the duties

of the committee or the Board shall dictate, and in any event, shall make at least one report annually at the Annual Meeting of members. All Standing Committees shall provide estimates of costs expected to be incurred in the following year and submit these estimates to the Board who shall pass it on to the Budget and Finance Committee for consideration in future budgets. All Committee meetings shall be open to all.

It has come to my attention that Del Johnson has moved out of Admirals Cove but has been allowed to maintain a presence on NextDoor.

Why, one must ask, would Del even want to continue to maintain an electronic presence on NextDoor?

As a long time antagonist of the pool, his need to continue to push his tilted agenda (posting "King Dustin," for example) when no longer living in AC creates question as to whether he is driven by altruism or compulsion or is simply a mouthpiece for others having to appear neutral.
