Gwyn,

The registered agent does not have to show you anything, nor does the registered agent have any obligation to respond to you, other than to sign a lawfully delivered summons or subpoena. They turn over communications they receive on behalf of the corporation to the board of directors. The only requirement for a registered agent is a physical address in the state of Washington. The registered agent may be any person in the state of Washington, business or not a business; corporation or individual; paid or unpaid.

Emails and telephone calls are not part of the registered agent's duties. Can you serve someone by telephone, email, or, text message? No.

The only purpose for a registered agent's physical address is to allow the physical service of papers on behalf the corporation; nothing else. The corporation can require members to mail documents and requests to the Club's PO Box. Unless you are serving us with a legal process, you do not have to go through the registered agent.

Stop bullying people and misrepresenting what the law says. And your email is only confidential while it is being transmitted. It can be shared with anyone after we receive it, no matter what you put at the bottom.

Inspection of club records is at 75 W. Keystone Ave, the corporations business address. It will not be at the registered agent's address.

Before you can be allowed to inspect any records, you must provide the club with a proper purpose reasonably related to membership interests. Its in our bylaws and RCW 24.03.

Please provide a statement that indicates the purpose for which you want to inspect the records. At this time, you have not provided a request sufficient to warrant its approval.

You will not be permitted to simply rummage through the records, and should therefore specify what records you want to inspect and why. We may ask that you pay the cost of having security present during the inspection, since the cost of inspecting or copying, if we choose to do that, is at the

expense of the member per RCW 24.03.

The Board of Directors will determine whether the purpose you provide is reasonably related to membership interests.

The RCW also prohibits a member from using or selling any of the information. This, you will not be permitted to use a membership list for mailings regarding Club business.

Here are the records you are entitled to inspect per RCW 24.03:

- **Current articles and bylaws (The Club will furnish a copy to members at no charge);**
- **A list of members, including names, addresses, and classes of membership, if any;**
- **Correct and adequate statements of accounts and finances;**
- **A list of officers' and directors' names and addresses;**
- **Minutes of the proceedings of meetings of the members, the board of directors, and any minutes that may be maintained by Club committees.**

You do not have the right to know the status of member's accounts, their phone numbers, or their email addresses. There are two classes of membership, active and associate. You will inspect a list of all 604 members if that is part of your request. The number list may change as soon as you complete your inspection. Until you specify exactly what records you wish to inspect, we cannot permit it, since some records, by law, are protected from inspection.
